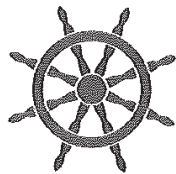

This purpose of this letter is to provide a statement of support on the impact that the Tampa Seniors in Service Volunteer Grandparents have on our Maximo Elementary students.

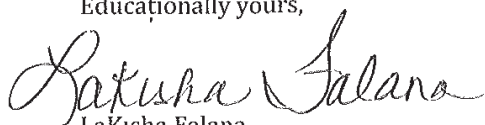
It wouldn't be a regular school day here at Maximo Elementary without the ever present, smiling faces of our Volunteer Grandmas. This year we were very fortunate to have six wise, patient, dedicated and strong women involved in classrooms from Pre-K to Grade 2. These six women put in approximately 5000 hours this past school year, all spent working with students individually or in small groups, inside the classroom. Obviously our classroom teachers have an incredible impact on their students, but our Grandmas come close in second! Having that extra adult on an almost full time basis is simply invaluable and has demonstrated time and time again its impact on the academic progress of our students.

One example of this influence is from our Grandma Pearl, who has been placed in our VPK (Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten) classroom. Grandma Pearl works one on one with 4 year old students, most of whom come to us in August not knowing the alphabet or how to spell their name. Usually by the winter break (a short 3-4 months), these students can now not only spell their names, but they also know all of their alphabet letters too! A strong Pre-K/Kindergarten foundation can make all the difference in the primary education years. This past year we strategically had 4 out of the 6 Grandmas placed in these grade levels.

The presence of the Volunteer Grandmas in our school also brings a wonderful sense of family to the school day- all of them are in fact addressed by the students as "Grandma" and in many ways fulfill that role for our challenged population. All of them come from the south St. Petersburg area and many of them actually know our students, and/or their families outside of school. Sometimes a quiet word or two of encouragement, or a simple hug can make the difference in the school day for any one of our students; our Grandmas often provide this level encouragement, which is priceless.

We have been fortunate to partnership with this program for almost 10 years. We look forward to the possibility of even more Grandmas being placed at Maximo if the opportunity arises, and definitely many more years of this successful partnership! Reason for Nomination:

Yvonne Hendrix is known as "Mee Maw" to the children, families, and staff of Lopez ESC where she has served as a foster grandmother for the past 13 years via the Seniors in Service Program. She works with special needs students who are severely mentally and physically challenged; ages 3-22 yrs., working mainly in a classroom of ages 3-11 yrs. of age. From feeding students who can't feed themselves, to accompanying them on field trips, pushing their wheelchairs during presentations, to assisting teachers and parents however needed; Mee Maw is there with a smile, hug, and mounds of encouragement. Her dedication continues beyond the school day while she volunteers at Special Olympics events occurring on weekends and attends School Spirit Nights at Beef O'Brady's restaurant in Seffner, a partner with the school. She has also done volunteer work with the Knights of Columbus group from a local church on behalf of Lopez ESC as they also serve as a school sponsor. She manages these activities despite walking with a cane herself. Ms. Hendrix's vision of serving special needs students began over 20 years ago when her special needs granddaughter

died at age 2 years. Although working in the corporate world at the time, she set the goal of serving special needs children upon retirement. She thus, began with the Seniors in Service Program and Lopez ESC after retiring from the IBM Corporation. My daughter, Lois, attended Lopez ESC for 10 years until entering heaven on 1/24/14. Mee Maw worked in her classroom during Lois' first 10 years at the Center. Mee Maw has been a steadfast support since the day she met Lois and has continued as such since her death, attending Child Loss Support groups with my husband and I and honoring Lois in ongoing ways. Ms. Hendrix has "Mee Maw" on her license plate and it is the word "Mee Maw" you hear when leaving a message on her phone. The "Mee Maw" of Lopez ESC she will always be and the best "Mee Maw" in the world she will always be to me! Respectfully Submitted, Cindy K. What Does Seniors in Service Do?

Seniors in Service of Tampa Bay is a 501(c)3 non-profit whose mission is to engage people in volunteerism, particularly those ages 55+, to help children succeed and elders remain independent by recruiting and training devoted and skillful volunteers.

Our programs are:

Retired Senior Volunteers Program (RSVP): 55+ volunteers can help the community in several categories from mentoring of elementary students to teaching healthy lifestyle choices to kids to providing senior companionship to using job skills to help non-profits become more successful. There is no minimum requirement for volunteering - serve as little as 1 hour. **"Got an hour? Give an hour!"**

Foster Grandparents: 55+ volunteers assist teachers in the classroom in mostly Title 1 schools, head start programs and after-school facilities. This program is a win-win-win for a senior volunteer to stay purposeful, a teacher in a high-risk school to receive caring help and students in high-risk schools to receive one-on-one mentoring and tutoring in their areas of greatest need.

Senior Companions: 55+ volunteers provide companionship and care to homebound, frail seniors. Volunteers gets as much benefit as clients when visiting a senior who needs compassion.
